

UNH HOUSING INFORMATION

PROJECT SMART will be housed in **Scott Hall**, which is located off Ballard Street in Durham.

Scott Hall includes three lounges to use for visiting or studying, a laundry room, a full kitchen, and a front porch with a great location facing Main St. in Durham. Students will be assigned to double rooms with genders separated by floor and/or wing.

Computers/Laptops are optional, although Wi-fi is available in Scott Hall. You will be supplied information on how to log onto the UNH wireless system as a guest user. There are no phone jacks in the rooms.

Laundry -- Washing their own clothes is the student's responsibility. Please be sure you know the basics of doing laundry! A laundry card will be provided for use (so no quarters are needed).

Additional costs incurred as a result of damages, etc. while at UNH will be your responsibility. If an item in your room is damaged during your stay, the cost of fixing or replacing that item will be charged to you. The University is not responsible for any lost, stolen, or damaged items.

Residential Policies

The Hall Staff will be enforcing certain policies and rules during your stay on campus, including those outlined on the Student Guidelines and Commitment that students and parents signed. These rules and others will be clearly explained upon your arrival.

Specific to the Residence Hall:

- No use of alcohol or other non-prescription drugs is allowed at any time.
- No visitors of the opposite sex will be allowed in student rooms at any time.
- Students are not allowed to leave campus without 3-day prior parental permission.
- Students are required to be in the hall by 7:00 pm each evening, except when group activities are planned by the staff.
- Students must be in their own rooms by 11:00 pm unless accompanied by a staff member.

Any inappropriate or disruptive behavior in the Residence Hall will be reported to Prof. Minocha and may result in various actions, including dismissal from the program.

Hall Staff

Scott Hall will be supervised by the following professional staff:

Darnelle is a full-time UNH employee with three years' experience working in residence halls, while Meredith, Joshua, and Emily are UNH students who also serve as UNH hall staff during the academic year.

The staff will be responsible for maintaining building and participant safety by enforcing policies, locking doors and being on duty each night for problems or emergencies. Hall staff will also provide social activities for the students at night and on weekends. The calendar of events will be reviewed during the first night's meeting.

Each student room is furnished with a bed, desk, desk chair, closet or wardrobe, and a dresser. All rooms have ceiling lights, and some also have study lamps. All room windows are covered with shades. See "What to Bring" list for additional room information (i.e. linens).

Driving Directions to UNH/Scott Hall

From the South:

Follow I-95 North to Exit 4 for in N.H. (N.H. Lakes and Mountains/Spaulding Turnpike). Exit 4 off 95 North is a left hand exit. Continue North to Exit 6W and follow Route 4 West for approximately 6 miles. Exit at Route 155A and turn left towards Durham (the 3rd exit that references "Durham") then turn left. Follow 155A past a short stretch of field to the UNH campus. Follow the directions below to Scott Hall.

From the North:

Follow I-95 South to Exit 5 in N.H. (Spaulding Turnpike). Continue North to Exit 6W and follow Route 4 West for approximately 6 miles. Exit at Route 155A (the 3rd exit that references "Durham") then turn left towards Durham. Follow 155A past a short stretch of field to the UNH campus. Follow the directions below to Scott Hall.

From the West:

Take Route 101 East to Exit 7 (Epping/Route 125). Continue North on Route 125 to the Lee Traffic Circle. Drive East on Route 4 to the Route 155A exit (the 1st Durham exit) then turn right towards Durham. Follow 155A past a short stretch of field to the UNH campus. Follow the directions below to Scott Hall.

To Scott Hall:

Approx. one-half mile from the exit, you will pass our Football stadium on your right and will come to a stop light. Get into the left lane to go straight, and you will see Thompson Hall (the clock tower) on your right. Across from Thompson Hall, turn left onto Garrison

Ave. Take the first left onto Ballard St. (comes up fairly quickly). Follow the road around the loop at the top of the hill, and turn right into the parking lot in the back of the building.

Hall staff will be present for check in. You will be instructed to unload and then park at the Elliot Alumni Center (EAC) where the opening welcome session will be held.
